museum, its exhibitions, educational offerings and unique mission continues to grow. "Our guests have loved what they've been able to experience and learn here, but they're eager to see even more," Crews said. "With the new expansion, we'll have additional room for our popular exhibitions as well as increased space for our diverse collections and research. We cannot thank the James family enough for making this possible."

Quilt House opened its current 37,000-square-foot building in 2008 with three exhibition galleries and state-of-the-art textiles storage as an international focal point for the study, conservation and exhibition of quilts. The modern, environmentally friendly building was designed by world renowned Robert A.M. Stern Architects of New York with local architects Alley Poyner Macchietto Architecture of Omaha. The same architects will design the new addition.

The \$12 million facility was privately funded with more than 260 contributions to the University of Nebraska Foundation, including a leadership gift from the Robert and Ardis James Foundation. More than 130 quilt guilds, as well as quilt organizations in six other countries, provided gifts toward the building campaign.



The International Quilt Study Center within Quilt House was founded in 1997 when Nebraska natives Ardis and Robert James began donating their extensive quilt collection and have since donated more than 1,000 quilts.

Ardis M. Butler James grew up in Lincoln and Omaha, Neb., and married Robert G. James of Ord, Neb., in 1949. They raised three children, Robert Jr., Catherine and Ralph, and made their home in Chappaqua, N.Y. Ardis James died on July 7, 2011.

Quilt House, 1523 North 33rd Street, is open 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays and 1 to 4 p.m. Sundays; closed Mondays and major holidays. Admission is \$6 for adults (over 18); \$3 for non-UNL students with ID and children; \$12 for families (up to two adults with their children and grandchildren); free for children under 4, museum members, and UNL faculty, staff and students with ID. February 12 - July 7, 2013 Post 9/11 Memorial Quilts by Don Beld. Don Beld has devoted much of his life since 2001 to honoring the sacrifice and service of people who lost their life due to a terrorist attack or through military service. This exhibition features Beld's quilted tributes to these ordinary and extraordinary individuals.

June 7, 2013 - March 2, 2014: The Engineer Who Could: Ernest Haight's Half-Century of Quiltmaking. A David City, Nebraska, farmer, a 1923 Phi Beta Kappa, and 1924 agricultural engineering graduate from UNL—was a prolific quiltmaker from 1935 – 1986. This exhibition presents Haight's quiltmaking as an extension of engineering processes and in the context of his family, religious, and community life and gender norms on the Great Plains.

IQSCM ANNOUNCES INTERIM DIRECTOR APPOINTMENT

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln is pleased to announce the appointment of Alice Kinsler as the International Quilt Study Center & Museum's interim executive director beginning August 5th. "It's an incredible honor to serve as the interim executive director of the IQSC&M and to help with the search for a permanent full-time executive director," Kinsler said.

"We anticipate that the IQSCM's reputation for excellence, encouragement of scholarship, its remarkable collection and striking building will attract a high level of candidates" said Michael James, Chair of the Textiles, Merchandising & Fashion Design Department (TMFD), who will oversee the search process.

Founding Director Patricia Cox Crews ends her 16-year tenure on August 3rd. She will assist Kinsler during a transition period, and plans to return to full-time teaching and research in TMFD, where she has been a faculty member since 1984. "The IQSCM is an extraordinary museum and research center, and Crews has done a fine job preparing it for a new director to lead the museum in it's next phase of development," said Marjorie Kosteninik, Dean of the College of Education and Human Services (CEHS).

Alice Kinsler graduated from Ball State University in Indiana in 1870, and holds master degrees in human relations from Golden Gate University in San Francisco (1984) and in textile history with a quilt studies emphasis from UNL (2007). She served as the president and chief executive officer of Hospice Foundation in Monterey, California from 1998 until her retirement in June 2013. As it's first chief executive, Kinsler, 65, started the organization's grant program to fund local hospice care and other services for people at the end of life in Monterey and San Benito counties. In October 2012, Hospice Foundation awarded \$1.4 million to 12 local nonprofits, bringing to \$20 million the total awarded locally during Kinsler's tenure.

Before that, Kinsler served nine years as director of the Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation, four years as associate director of Community Foundation for Monterey County and prior to that development director of the Carmel Bach Festival.

"As we move forward in our executive search for the museum's next director, Alice's experience in administration, management, communications and development will be an immense asset. Her appointment will provide strong transitional leadership for the museum," said Michael James.

A PRAIRIE HOMECOMING & SWEET MEMORIES

At the 1988 QuiltNebraska convention, in an effort to cut costs, the traditional desserts were not served. Following that event, Lois Gottsch spearheaded a project to collect “Dessert” quilt blocks from NSQG Board members and QuiltNebraska Chairmen. So many quilt blocks were donated that two dessert quilts were created!

At the 1989 QuiltNebraska convention, the quilts were put on poles and paraded to the podium where Sara Dillow and Judy McClure (and possibly one other) were waiting. As the quilts were presented, I can imagine the members rising to their feet, cheering and clapping with laughter ringing out through the banquet room and into the hallways. Can't you?

At the next convention in Grand Island, the idea continued. Lois Gottsch and committee members had sewn and stuffed little canvas bags with chocolate kisses. These candy bags were passed out to anyone needing a “chocolate fix”. Elinor Peace Bailey, the guest speaker, even threw out chocolate kisses from the podium!

Total income was \$36,323.90, expenses were \$33,931.16 for a cash increase \$2,392.74. At the end of the year we had \$22,789.98 in our checking account. We had \$30,312.89 in market savings and \$37,505.22 in CD's for a total of \$90,608.09. We do have liabilities that we have to keep cash reserves for future QuiltNebraska's for payment of contracted instructors and such in the amount of \$92,350.00.

Awards: Report included. Cindy Scheinost wanted to thank her committee for their dedication, and thoughtful consideration of the nominees. They are Region I – Jean Ang, Jan Hatfield, Connie Olson; Region II – Linda Acuff, Janice Lippincott, Jayne Schlosser; Region III – Janet Kugler, Vickie Wiens, and Cindy Scheinost, Chairwoman. Anyone interested in serving on this committee, please contact Cindy.

On Saturday, July 28, 2012 at the 27th annual meeting of the Nebraska State Quilt Guild (NSQG), in LaVista, area quilters were honored during the evening banquet. This six people and two guilds were carefully vetted by a committee of nine women from across the state and deemed worthy of the Nebraska State Quilt Guild's highest honors.

The Friendship Star was awarded to volunteer Patricia Varner of Bellevue for her creative and organizational abilities in planning the three and a half day event of 40+ classes taught by 6 nationally known and 20 Nebraska teachers, and activities that covered everything from historical aspects to the latest tools and techniques of quilts.

Susan Weber of Lincoln was honored with the Radian Star for her organizational efforts in the making of a quilt that commemorates the 150th anniversary of the National Homestead Act. Both the Mother's Guild of Boys Town and the Quilters Quilt Club of Shelby were also given the Radiant Star for the multitude of quilts they have made for many years, in support of their respective local communities.

For their recent and noteworthy contributions to the art of quilt making, Amanda Benz of Kearney, and Jan Hibbs of Smithfield were awarded the Silver Thread. Both women not only make award winning quilts, but are teachers who encourage others to either start or expand on quilt making skills. Amanda and Jan are also extremely busy volunteering their "quilt time" to the betterment of their local and state wide communities in a variety of ways.

Peg Pennell who recently moved from Omaha to Ashland has been a very popular teacher, award winning quilt maker and fiber artist for over 25 years. In the last several years, she has won international recognition with her creative quilt art, and has published patterns. She is very involved in her local guild and supports the Nebraska State Quilt Guild in whatever way she is needed. For her consistent and great contributions to quilt making, Peg was honored with the Golden Thread Award.

The most prestigious award given by the Nebraska State Quilt Guild, the Hall of Fame award is not given out every year, but only on the occasion of a truly worthy individual. This year we recognize Dianne Duncan Thomas of Omaha who is a founding mother of the Nebraska State Quilt Guild in 1985, and has never tired in her efforts to support the Guild and all aspects of quilting. Her prize winning quilts have been seen at the State Fair, and have been successful fund raisers. She is constantly involved in guild leadership positions, is a teacher, a promoter, in fund raising and in any way to encourage the art of quilt making. She is President of the Friends of the International Quilt Study Center in Lincoln, one of many chairpersons for QNE 2012, and is involved in numerous other quilt organizations. In honor of her mother, Dianne and family donated the sculpture in front of the International Quilt Study Center. She has successfully devoted nearly 30 years to promote quilting.

The Nebraska State Quilt Guild wishes to congratulate these people for their generous contributions to the art of quilt making.

Special Recognition: Sandra Kosch awarded two additional Award Certificates to Jan Stehlik for her winning design of the Homestead Act of 1862 quilt project (Susan Weber accepted it for Jan due to Jan's absence) and Shelly Burge for her winning

design of the Governor's Mansion Quilt Project. Also Merikay Berg received an Award Certificate as the Sole Quilter of the Governor's Mansion Quilt Project when the quilt was unveiled at the Governor's Mansion on August 11, 2012. Merikay was absent at the Annual Meeting.

Susan Weber reported on Quiltmakers and Quilters who created the "Images of Homesteading" Quilting in honor of the 150th Anniversary of the signing by Abraham Lincoln of the Homestead Act of 1862. The original NSQG Ad Hoc committee for this project included: Merikay Berg, NSQG President 2009 from Lexington, Susan Weber, NSQG President 2011 & 2012 NSQG Advisor (formerly of Dorchester & Milford, now of Lincoln), Sandra Kosch, NSQG President 2012 from Shelby Ranger-Susan Cook, Homestead National Monument in Beatrice.

Project was funded by Frieda Weber Memorial monies. Frieda was a long time education and quilt enthusiast.

The sleeves were hand sewn by Sandra Kosch and Sheila Green.

Governor's Mansion Quilt Project Committee: Sandra Kosch, Susan Weber, Merikay Berg and Sheila Green.

The quilt design was inspired by a quilt by Judy Martin.

By-Laws and Policies: Report by Fay Kliewer. The By-Laws and Policies and Procedures have been reorganized and are now available for viewing on the NSQG website.

Education: Sheila Green reported that Discover Nebraska has again been the focus for NSQG Education this year. There have been great successes with many communities offering Discover Nebraska presentations to their fourth graders.

This past year, presentations have been held in Lincoln, Seward, Wahoo, Gothenburg, and Gordon. About 50 volunteers have been involved!

In the 2011-2012 school year, the Lincoln Quilters Guild group presented in 38 schools (about 2,840 Children) children in Lincoln and the surrounding area, including Waverly, Syracuse, Conestoga, Louisville, Raymond Central at Valparaiso, and Eagle. We are also offering presentations at the International Quilt Study Center and Museum. This may be of interest to schools outside the Lincoln area as they come to Lincoln for field trips. There is a grant available from the Nebraska Arts Council that can cover busing and museum admission.

Sheila spoke about Discover Nebraska at the Plum Creek Quilt Guild meeting in Lexington for their Guest Night, to encourage their members to begin Discover Nebraska in their community.

An education display was provided and staffed at the Original Quilt and Sew Expo at Pershing Auditorium in Lincoln last fall.

My goal is to continue training individuals and guilds to start Discover Nebraska presentations in their communities. I have NSQG Discover Nebraska Quilts that can be lent to all. Contact me for complete packets of information to get you started, including master copies of all needed classroom materials.

Friends of IQSC & Museum: No Report

Historian: Report included. Sandra Anderson reported that the 2011 scrapbook has been completed and is working on 2012. Thank you to all who have taken photos at different events and forwarded them to me. I have now learned what a flash drive is. I have taken more records from various committees to be placed in the archives at Love Library. Anyone can have things put in the archives. If you want instructions you

may call or e-mail me and I will get you started. Keep those photos and news articles and clippings coming. I appreciate your contributions very much.

Library Project: Report included. Janalee Petsch reported that Freemotion Quilting by award winning Nebraska author Judy Woodworth, was chosen as the 2012 selection for the NSQG Library Project. Criteria for selection included: a subject that had not been covered in recent years, consider how new the title is, and select a Nebraska author if possible. Judy's quilt, Avatar Revisited, won the APQS Longarm Machine Quilting Award at the most recent AQS Show in Paducah, KY. This book selection proved to be a popular choice.

Budget for the 2012 Library Project was \$3900.

Expenses were:

Books (free shipping from publisher)	\$3136.98
Supplies (envelopes, labels)	\$87.80
Postage (Library rate mail)	\$679.15
Total Expenses	\$3903.93

The book was mailed to 290 Nebraska Public Libraries, with a cover letter included with each book explaining the NSQG Library Project plus directions to the NSQG website for more information. A reply card was designed requesting the library to respond with YES, we add the quilting book to our collection and would like to continue to receive a book each year, or NO, we are unable to use the books and would like to be dropped from the list. Libraries were given the option of replying by email, or by returning the card through postal mail. Of the 290 libraries, 136 responded to far – 125 gave a definite YES, with many comments on how the libraries appreciated the book and that their patrons looked forward to it each year. Eleven libraries have indicated NO, they do not wish to be a part of the NSQG Library Project. Those libraries have been noted and will be removed from the mail list next year.

Recommendations for 2013: A yearly reply card does not seem necessary, but perhaps in another five years or so it would be useful to ask again. Also, recommended to continue the NSQG Library Project, sending a book to every library except those requesting to be dropped.

Membership: Report included. Darice Cecil reported that as of July 25, membership stands at: Renewals – 505 and New – 68 for a total of 573. We don't have the final count of membership from QNE 2012 yet. The 2012 membership is up by 151 members since January 1, 2012.

Nebraska State Fair Quilt Liaison: Kay Grimminger stated that Jan Sittler would be giving the report.

Nebraska State Fair Quilt Superintendent: Report included. Jan Sittler reported that "High Flying Fun" is the theme of the 2012 Nebraska State Fair. Changes have been made to provide more parking, more shuttles, new shows, new events and a sky tram! Additional lighting and more permanent pipe racks were added to the Quilt Hall. The Quilt Show promises again to be one of the State Fair's most popular events.

New Opportunities: Four new competition classes: a quilt from recycled components, a doll quilt class for adults and 2 additional Senior Adult classes and five new special contests; which are Best Scrappy Quilt, Best Humorous Quilt, Best Blue & White Quilt, Best Quilt from the Southwest Nebraska Counties and the Diamond Award to the best quilt in the Senior Adult classes made by someone over the age of 75 - for a total of 96 classes. Best of County-Needlework will be split into two contests: Best in County-Quilts (displayed in the Quilt Hall) and Best in County-Textile Arts (displayed with Textile Arts in the Fonner Park Concourse).

Thanks again to the donors: individuals, guilds and shops, we have a record number of donors for special ribbons, cash, and gift certificates.

Threads 2011 had 851 guests with 32 vendors. One vendor from Missouri complimented us on the quality of the show. They were impressed with the quilts we had. Quilts of Valor was also represented. Being in a new facility was fun; we learned what to do again this year and what to change. The vendors appreciated being able to drive up to their booth to unload their merchandise.

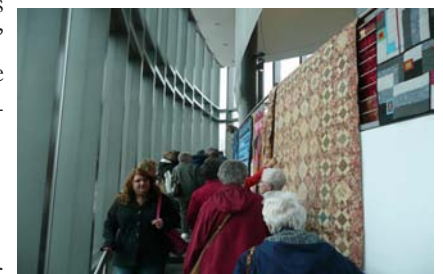
Nebraska State Quilt Guild members sold 272 raffle quilt tickets.
