## 2016 Nebraska State Fair Quilt Show Sponsor Recruitment

February 1, 2016 is the deadline for return of the Sponsor forms from guilds, businesses, small groups and individuals. The forms were mailed out to all 2015 participants in early January. We work through the month of February to check sponsor details and prepare the Entry Book. Sponsor renewal agreements must be done in writing (email or hard copy). Very few Entry Book changes are required for the 2016 NSF Quilt Show but when changes are needed, we sometimes have to re-assign sponsors. Thank you for your understanding and flexibility as we work to provide coverage for all the classes and contests.

This is also a good time for guilds to review their current sponsorship to be sure it still fits with their group's

wishes. Last year the average cash or gift certificate was \$20 to \$30 though amounts vary from \$15 to \$50. Special ribbons continue to attract attention from fair visitors and award recipients love them. Ribbons need not be complicated. The internet and magazines have ideas which can be incorporated into an interesting and beautiful ribbon. Fair visitors seem to enjoy looking up the quilt exhibit they or their group have sponsored.

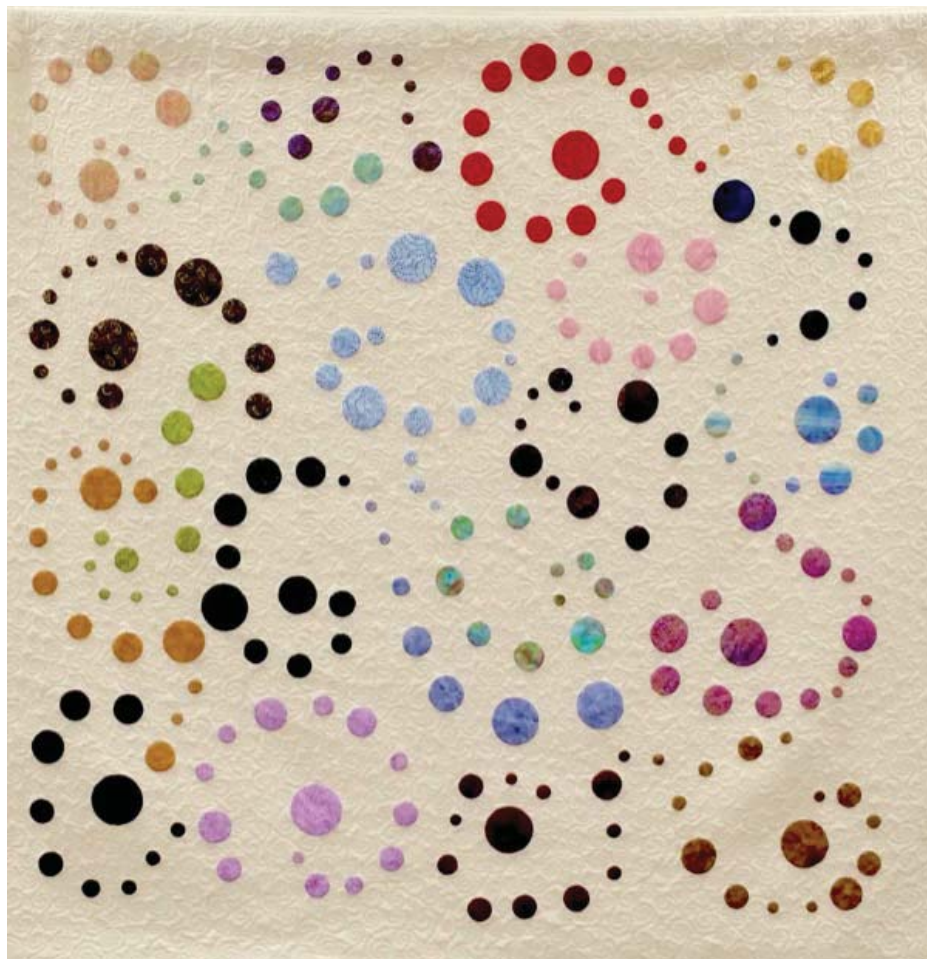

Please no large embellishments that might cause damage to other quilts when stacked together for transporting from one show to another. Show your diversity as we celebrate Nebraska's 150th year of Statehood.

### Rules:

1. Quilt must measure 24” square (not on point), have a hanging sleeve and a label.
2. Any techniques may be used. Quilts may not be “dimensional” as to ensure safety of quilts during transporting as quilts will be stacked on top of each other. Small beads, charms or yarns attached securely may be used.
3. Quilts must be made entirely by the entrant. No “group” entries accepted.
4. Viewer's Choice prize will be awarded to top 3 wall quilts.

## Omaha Quilters' Guild Give Over \$14,000

Some children in foster care are fortunate to be placed with families who are able to provide generously at Christmas time. But many years ago, it was apparent that other children were left out during the holidays, especially those who had just been placed in protective custody, and those who were in shelter care. Also in need were those moving from one family to another, or those who were moving back home around Christmas. The Omaha Quilters' Guild became aware of the need and in 1992, created the Children's Emergency Fund. The project originally focused on sewing Christmas stockings but has since grown into a multifaceted, annual event. There are four ways for members to participate in the project.

Our members make stockings and there are donations of stocking stuffers. The Angel Bags are filled with age and sex appropriate, unwrapped gifts to be delivered to Child Protection for distribution by the caseworkers.

We also have a mini-raffle where members make and donate items to be raffled to each other. The Caring Friends Auction draws friends together to make quilted projects, again to be auction to each other at our annual Christmas dinner. All the proceeds from these fun events benefit CPS.

The December meeting is one of the highlights of the year as members enjoy good food, good friends and a feeling of well-being. It's a great reward to use our talents and enthusiasm for such a meaningful cause. We each are reminded that working together, we can do so much to bring light into the life of a child.

The party this year was as successful as in the past. We had more than 503 stockings. It took a 17 foot u-haul for the toys and the stocking store was set up for two days for the caseworkers. Child Protective Services received a little over \$14,000 from the annual Christmas party.
