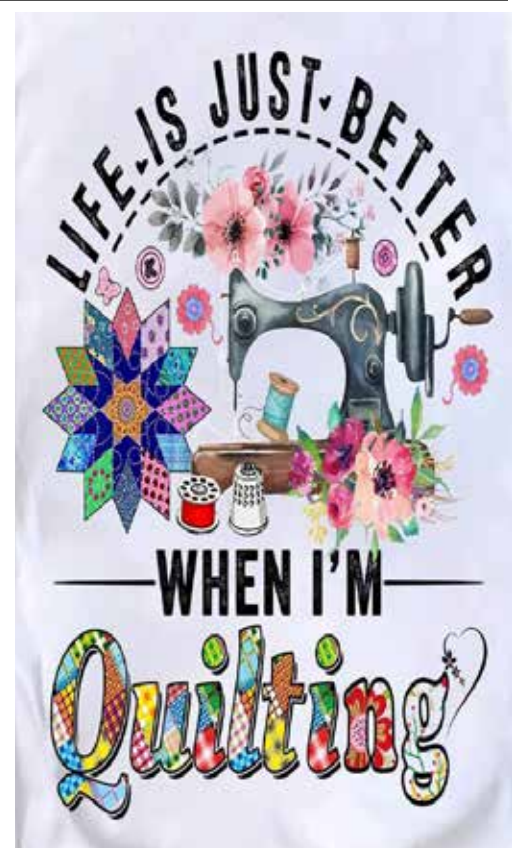

Our featured quilter this year is Janice Lippencott. Janice credits the Nebraska State Quilt Guild (NSQG) for her love of quilting. She has been a seamstress for as long as she can remember. She was the Nebraska State 4-H Clothing Champion in 1956. Janice took her first quilting class in 1990 and the rest is history. She has served as NSQG regional representative, President elect and President. She co-chaired Quilt Nebraska in 2018. She credits taking classes from national teachers at Quilt Nebraska as the way she learned new techniques and improved her quilting skills.

Diversity describes the types of quilts Janice has made. She enjoys many techniques including

piecing, embroidery, paper piecing and applique as well as quilted garment making. Janice has won awards at the County Fair, State Fair, and numerous quilt shows. Janice shares her quilts with others through donations to the Washington County fair helping to raise approximately \$20,000. She also donates to Camp Carol Joy Holling's annual event as her church craft fair.

Janice has taught quilt classes and lectures across the state. She holds memberships in NSQG, Cottonwood, Blair Bunch Quilters and the Sunbonnet Sues. She has served as President of her local guild as well as quilt show chair. Janice has been the recipient of the Friendship Star Award, Silver Thimble Award, Gold-

en Thimble Award and inducted into the Nebraska Quilter's Hall of Fame.

### AWARD CATEGORIES

*Hall of Fame* - Lifetime achievement and significant contributions to the heritage and art of quilts and quilt making for the State of Nebraska.

*Golden Thread* - Consistent efforts and great contributions to the art of quilt making.

*Silver Thread* - Recent achievements and contributions to the art of quilt making.

*Radiant Star* - "Outstanding Deed Well Done!"

*Variable Star* - Recognizes a noteworthy individual's contribution to the heritage of quilt making.

*Friendship Star* - Recognizes "Bringing Friends Together", is an automatic award given to chairperson(s)

of QuiltNebraska and awarded the same year of the convention that they chair; the countless hours of planning and coordinating and endless list of tasks to make our conventions wonderful and a memorable time. No nominations are required.

*Outstanding Nebraska State Quilt Guild* - This award is designed for a Quilt Guild in Nebraska that performs above and beyond the regular duties of a Quilt Guild. They must perform an ongoing special project(s) or a one time major project to better their guild and their Community. A nominating Quilt Guild must be in existence for at least 5 years. It can be different community causes supported, but something that is done every year. At least one nomination letter must come from the community group that the Guild is benefiting. Rather than a medal to the winning Quilt Guild, a plaque will be awarded. A Guild may only receive the award once and commit to continuing support to their community.

## The Future of Threads Across Nebraska is in Your Hands!

I am working on my last year as coordinator for Threads Across Nebraska. When the 2023 show is over I will have been involved with Threads Across Nebraska for 15 years. I have enjoyed meeting everyone and making new friends. Now it is time for others to have that wonderful experience!

Yes, I have coordinated the show by myself. This is a job that can be done by a group or committee, and I would like to share how it can be broken down into smaller jobs. First, most of the preparation can be done anywhere because communication with the Buffalo County Fairgrounds and Construction Rental is done by phone or email. I live here and I didn't go to either place until set-up on Wednesday. The job can be broken into individuals working with: vendors, advertising, publicity (sending out brochures and posters), volunteer coordinator, quilt coordinator, class coordinator lining up classes (selection of teachers and registration).

The only person that would need to be close to Kearney is the person responsible for putting out signs. There are 6- 4'x4' wooden signs that need to have the dates changed and put up a month before the show and taken down at the end of the show. There are also 70 yard signs that need to be put out the Sunday before the show and taken down after the show. It takes about 2 hrs putting up the big signs and 3.5 hrs to put out the yard signs. Homes and businesses are called (there is a list) beforehand for permission. This can be broken down into sections of town with a few people.

The weekend of the show the vendor coordinator would be checking in the vendors on Thursday and working with them during the show. The quilt coordinator would be checking in the quilts and responsible for hanging the quilts as well as quilt security for checkout. The class coordinator would be working with the teachers to make sure everything is set up and participants checked in .

Ideally, it would be great to have someone or a committee in place very soon to work beside me as I put together the 2023 show. I have put together a timeline with jobs. I am happy to answer any questions you might have about any of the responsibilities. I can be reached at lkillion@gmail.com or 308-440-8867.

### **Uncovering Black History: Quilts From The Collection Of Carolyn Mazloomi** **October 21, 2022 to March 25, 2023**

“When one faction of American society is excluded from the master narrative of our collective histories, the whole society loses.”

Quilts by Black quiltmakers always existed within the greater canon of American quilting as it developed in the nineteenth and twentieth century. Quilts, especially those with a narrative element, have been a particularly vital tool that Black makers use to illustrate Black History.

Today’s Black quiltmakers continue that tradition. Their quilts function “by voicing, in cloth ... the struggles and triumphs of a marginalized people,” acting as a means to educate “citizens about important segments of our complex authentic, national history.” The contrast of comforting cloth juxtaposed with disturbing images makes a compelling, educational, and artistic combination.

Collector, scholar, and maker Carolyn Mazloomi sought work by artists with powerful voices as she built her collection. The artists present a variety of Black experiences, some celebrating the achievements of artists, poets, and adventurers, and others protesting the pervasive and harmful racism directed towards people of color in American society.

### **Paula Nadelstern: I Am a Patternista** **November 11, 2022 to April 9, 2023**

Paula Nadelstern is known for her use of intricate symmetrical prints in kaleidoscope-themed quilts, employing a distinctive approach that obscures, rather than defines, the seams. Able to find patterns in anything, everywhere she goes, some of Paula’s greatest inspiration comes from her travels and places that are special to her, such as the ceiling of the Spanish Synagogue in Prague in the Czech Republic or the Brooklyn Bridge in New York City, USA. In her art, Paula filters every image of inspiration through a kaleidoscopic lens. She conjures the luminous, fluid and fleeting nature of the kaleidoscope using its unique and symmetrical philosophy in all of her work. The visual excitement of color, motion and shape in her quilts imitates the endless possibilities that kaleidoscopes represent.

To Paula, being a “Patternista” is about combining log-

ic with outer beauty when choosing fabrics. This method lends itself particularly well to kaleidoscope quilts, which depend on creating a quilt that appears equally random and controlled. Paula says that “symmetry and serendipity laced with abundant color and pattern,” are the heartbeats of her quilts. With a strong eye for seeing pattern everywhere, and the endless layouts the kaleidoscope formula provides, Paula Nadelstern will never run out of inspiration.

Paula Nadelstern lives on the same block where she grew up in the Bronx and is the recipient of fellowships from the New York Foundation for the Arts and The Bronx Council on the Arts. She has written several books, including *Kaleidoscopes & Quilts*, *Snowflakes & Quilts*, *Puzzle Quilts: Simple Blocks, Complex Fabric*, Paula Nadelstern’s *Kaleidoscope Quilts: An Artist’s Journey Continues*, *Kaleidoscope Quilts: The Workbook* and *FABRICADABRA: Simple Quilts, Complex Fabric*. Befitting a “Patternista” Paula also designs textiles for Benartex, Inc.

### **Black at Work: The Color Black in Quilts from the Collection** **November 22, 2022 to March 25, 2023**

Black at Work examines how quiltmakers represented in the International Quilt Museum collection have utilized the color black as a visual or conceptual element in their textiles. It positions black as a serious and active representational tool with the power to change or enhance the way we see, perceive, and understand the world around us.

Whether black is used to generate contrast, to create borders, or to render illusions of dimensionality, it is essential to our experience of objects and space. In addition to analyzing how black engages the eye, this exhibition asks viewers to reflect on black as a concept that shapes social thoughts and categorizations. Within popular culture, black is symbolic of sophistication, darkness, mystery, and evil. Black can unify a group, as in “black tie affair”, or can segregate as a marker of racial difference.

In its varied presences, black invites a meditation on the complexities of our visual, psychological, and intellectual world. Concerned with more than just the appearance of the color, Black at Work asks, what does black do?



## NSQG Grant

In an effort to promote quilting, the Nebraska State Quilt Guild will provide financial grants to Nebraska quilt guilds wishing to sponsor a quilt event. We want to encourage guild members to create new ways to build interest in quilting. A committee has been formed to consider all applications. Twice a year, the Grant Committee will choose guilds to receive this financial help. Application deadlines are January 1 and June 1. Applicants will receive a response from the Grant Committee by January 30 and June 30.

In your own words, tell us about your event idea. Please include the points listed below:

1. An applicant must be an NSQG member in good standing. (current year NSQG dues paid)
2. The event must be educational and promote the art of quilting in Nebraska
3. The event must be open to the public
4. A budget for you event must be provided
5. Please state the dollar amount you are requesting from NSQG (Please note NSQG reserves the right to decide the amount awarded)
6. Proposed time and location of the event

Other requirements include:

- NSQG must be named as a sponsor of the event
- Photos of the event and copies of advertising must be provided to the Grant Committee
- If the event is canceled for any reason, the money given by NSQG must be returned

## White Chicken Chili

2 1/2 cups water  
1 teaspoon lemon pepper seasoning  
1 teaspoon ground cumin  
1 tablespoon olive oil  
4 boneless skinless chicken breast halves  
1 clove garlic, finely chopped  
1 cup chopped onion  
2 (8 ounce) cans white shoepeg corn, drained  
2 (4 ounce) cans chopped green chilies, undrained  
2 -3 tablespoons lime juice

2 (14 ounce) cans great northern beans, undrained  
shredded monterey jack cheese, to garnish

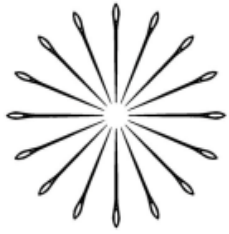
### DIRECTIONS

In a 5-qt stockpot, combine water with the lemon pepper, 1 tsp ground cumin, and olive oil. Bring to a boil. Add the chicken breast halves and return to a low boil, then reduce the heat to low and simmer 20-30 minutes or until the chicken is fork tender and the juices are clear. Remove the chicken from the broth and cut into bite-size pieces, then return it to the broth. Add the garlic, onion, corn, green chiles, lime juice, and Great Northern beans to the broth. Bring to a boil. Simmer until thoroughly heated, about 45 minutes.

To serve, ladle into soup bowls and sprinkle cheese on top.
