Arlen's profession was a carpenter, with exact measuring and cutting skills he tried his hand at piecing and found it a great way to grow his skills. Diversity describes the many types of quilts made by Arlen & Sue. The harder the challenge, the better he enjoys what he is doing. Through the many years that they have been creating quilts, they explored a multitude of techniques, from piecing simple patterns to intricate curves to embroidery (hand & machine), applique, stack & whack. Victoria Findlay Wolfe: Option Expedition

April 19, 2024 - Dec. 14, 2024 • Coryell Gallery

In Option Expedition, Victoria Findlay Wolfe takes basic shapes of patchwork — square, circle, triangle, parallelogram — and breaks down design principles of space, balance, scale, line, shape, color, emphasis, contrast, value, repetition, movement, texture, and unity to look at the bold, beautiful choices available. As a teacher, Victoria Findlay Wolfe finds that people often spend so much time trying to edit their work that they get stuck making decisions, which makes it hard to move forward. Findlay Wolfe believes each idea is a good one, or has the potential to be a good one. By changing the way they look at each of those design elements, artists can train themselves to see differently in their own creative process. Findlay Wolfe hopes that this exploration will inspire other artists to ponder their own journey while viewing her work.

REBOUND - RENEW - REIMAGINE: The Manhattan Quilters Guild

April 26, 2024 - Dec. 14, 2024 • Gottsch Gallery

The artists of the Manhattan Quilters Guild present new work that celebrates a return to pre-Covid life. The guild created this project to celebrate rebounding from the restrictions that limited personal contact and renewing activities which were not possible during the pandemic. Each of the Manhattan Quilters Guild artists participating in REBOUND – RENEW – REIMAGINE created a new quilt designed to be defined by a title beginning with “re.”

The Manhattan Quilters Guild is a diverse group of New York City-area quilters dedicated to promoting the art of quilting and furthering professionalism in the field. The guild began in 1980 as a small gathering of strangers who responded to an ad in Quilter's Newsletter Magazine. Over time, it has become a professional organization of international artists who exhibit individually and together. They are designers, gallerists, curators, teachers, writers, bloggers, mentors, and entrepreneurs. Their work, rooted in a traditional craft, has evolved into fiber art forms that often go beyond quilts.

Hi Fellow quilters!

How many of you have started? WELL, if you haven't here is your chance to get started with instructions 1-5

I will give a little more clarification if you haven't - hopefully you will be very excited once you see the next set of instructions.

1. Start with a 2 1/2 in square - ugly is what you are looking to achieve.

2. Incorporate a "left over" 5 inch square

Clarification - this can be any 5 inch square (or scrap- the judges will never know) Put this around the 2 1/2 square - you can make it into triangles and trim to have a square in a square, or cut into strips and just add around the edges, no rules here

3. Add a 10 x 10 square gifted to you

Clarification - Gifted can mean you bought it for yourself (the judges will never know - and I encourage buying yourself fabric.

Clarification - you do NOT have to use the full 10 x 10 square - if you only use 5 inches - that is fine

Oh - clarification - you don't have to tell me if you did not use a 10 x 10 square to get this round. IF you

are a thrifty quilter and dug through your stash, I won't tell.

4. NEW - Add a round of your FAVORITE color - anything you want on round 4

5. NEW - round of GREY or WHITE - that is the only requirement

Just remember the maximum size is 120 inches, minimum is anything you want.

I have added a picture of where my round robin is after 3 steps

Blueberry French Toast Casserole

CASSEROLE

12 slices day-old white bread, crusts removed

2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese

1 cup blueberries (I use more)

12 eggs

2 cups milk

1/2 cup maple syrup or 1/2 cup honey

2 teaspoons cinnamon

SAUCE

1 cup sugar

2 tablespoons cornstarch

1 cup water

1 cup blueberries

1 tablespoon butter

DIRECTIONS

Cut bread into 1-inch cubes; place half in greased 9x13 inch baking dish. Cut cream

cheese into 1-inch cubes; place over bread. Top with blueberries and remaining bread.

In a large bowl, beat eggs, milk, and syrup mix well. Pour over bread mixture, sprinkle with cinnamon. Cover and chill 8 hours or overnight.

Remove from fridge 30 minutes before baking. Cover and bake at 350°F for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake for 30 more minutes or until golden brown and the center is set.

In a saucepan, combine sugar, cornstarch, add water. Bring to boil over medium heat; boil for 3 minutes stirring constantly. Stir in blueberries; reduce heat. Simmer for 8-10 minutes or until berries have burst. Stir in butter until melted.

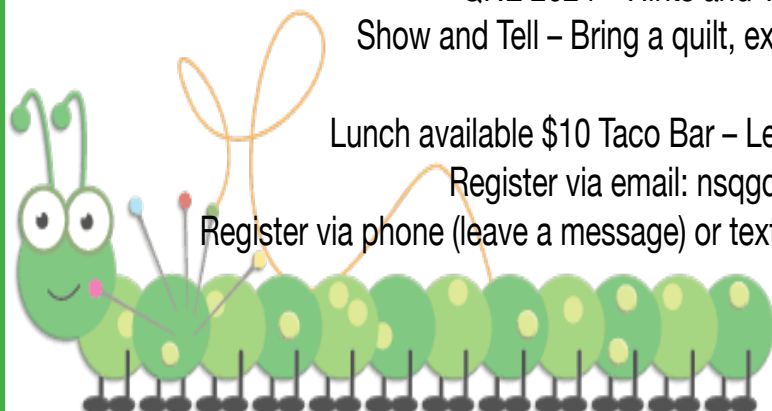

AWARD CATEGORIES

Hall of Fame - Lifetime achievement and significant contributions to the heritage and art of quilts and quilt making for the State of Nebraska.

Golden Thread - Consistent efforts and great contributions to the art of quilt making.

Silver Thread - Recent achievements and contributions to the art of quilt making.

Radiant Star - "Outstanding Deed Well Done!"

Variable Star - Recognizes a noteworthy individual's contribution to the heritage of quilt making.

Friendship Star - Recognizes "Bringing Friends Together", is an automatic award given to chairperson(s) of QuiltNebraska and awarded the

same year of the convention that they chair; the countless hours of planning and coordinating and endless list of tasks to make our conventions wonderful and a memorable time. No nominations are required.

Outstanding Nebraska State Quilt Guild - This award is designed for a Quilt Guild in Nebraska that performs above and beyond the regular duties of a Quilt Guild. They must perform an ongoing special project(s) or a one time major project to better their guild and their Community. A nominating Quilt Guild must be in existence for at least 5 years. It can be different community causes supported, but something that is done every year. At least one nomination letter must come from the community group that the Guild is benefiting. Rather than a medal to the winning Quilt Guild, a plaque will be awarded. A Guild may only receive the award once and commit to continuing support to their community.
